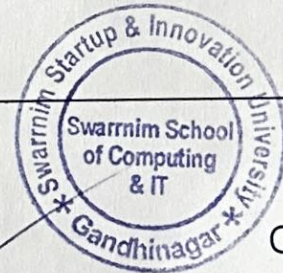

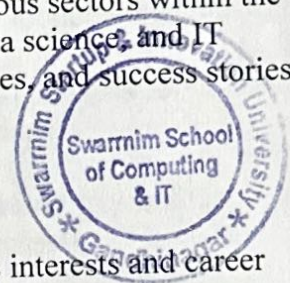
3. Panel Discussion

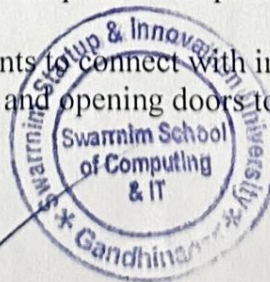
7. Networking Lunch

- Exposure to industry success stories and direct interaction with professionals boosted students' motivation and confidence, encouraging them to pursue their career aspirations with determination.

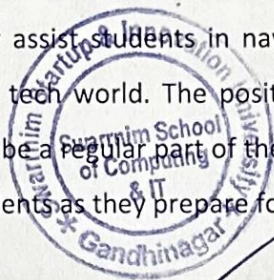

Introduction

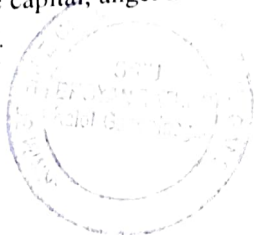
Key Components of a Startup Ecosystem

He step by step discussed other Soft skills like Attitude, Confidence, Motivation, Problem solving and Decision making and its importance. He also explained Do's and Don'ts as well

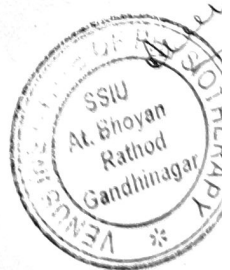
