- 4. To prepare deviation chart after discussion with respective HOD or Principal.
- 5. To prepare admission policy and admission eligibility criteria of the respective course.
- 6. Everyone should know the deadlines of the admission and should not admit students after deadline.
- 7. To prepare file of seats reduction and increase in the seats.



8. Every institute should make Academic Bulletin with the name of Academic Bulletin of <name of the respective institute> explaining courses, subjects coding systems, credit systems, evaluation system and others year wise.

9. Every institute shall appoint one research coordinator to collect and maintain records of research publication and such other information related to research.

- 10. Students' information should be put on notice board with reference no. duly signed by the concerned authority and proper filing of same has to be maintained by the respective institute.
- 11. Every instruments and furniture should have inventory no. and proper list of stock.

The total number of Higher Faculty shall not be less than nineteen. This relaxation is for seeking conditional permission to undertake admission for particular academic session. For example- the college having sixty-one to hundred seats intake capacity shall have minimum forty total faculties, out of which minimum nineteen Professors or Readers covering all fourteen Departments.

#### NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 7th November, 2016

No. 28-15/2016-Ay.(MSR).--In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (j) of section 36 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) and in supersession of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012, except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Central Council of Indian Medicine, with the previous sanction of the Central Government, hereby makes the following regulations, to regulate the requirement of colleges for education in Ayurveda system of medicine, namely:

- Short title and commencement- (1) These regulations may be called the Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016.
  - They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official States.

  2. Definition. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, (a) "Act" means the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970);
  (b) "college" means an Under-graduate Ayurveda College or Institute;
  (c) "attached hospital" means a teaching Ayurveda hospital attached to the college;
  (a) "Central Council" means the Central Council of Indian Medicine.
- The words and expression used herein and not defined but defined in the Act shall have the respective meanings assigned to them in the Act

- 3. Requirements of Minimum Standard to grant of permission(1)(a) The Ayurveda colleges established under section 13A and existing under section 13C of the Act and their attached hospitals shall fulfill the requirements of minimum standard for infrastructure and teaching and training facilities referred to in the regulations 4 to 11 upto the 31st December of every year for consideration of grant of permissions for undertaking admissions in the coming academic session;
  - (b) the Central Council shall visit the college suo moto three months before the expiry of permission;
  - (c) the proforma of visit as prescribed by the Central Council on its website shall be filled online by the colleges and visitors respectively followed by submission of a hard copy of the same as per visitors guidelines issued by Central Council from time to time;
  - (d) the videography and photography of staff and infrastructure during the visit shall be made by the visitors and submitted along with detailed report and observations to the Central Council;
  - (e) after submission of online detailed report and observations by the visitors to the Central Council, the Central Council shall submit its recommendation along with detailed report to the Central Government within a period of one month from the submission of report by the visitors;

  - (f) the Central Council shall certify that teaching faculty present in the college is not working at any other place;
    (g) the position prevailed on the date of visit to assess the fulfilment of requirements as specified in these regulations except sub-regulation (2) of regulation 7 shall be taken into consideration for grant of conditional permission or permission for a period of five years to the colleges.

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#### (2) Requirements of Minimum Standard to grant of permission for a period of five years-

- (a) After fulfilment of the requirement as per these regulations by the college, the permission shall be granted to undertake admissions for a period of five years. The college shall be randomly inspected within the said period on receipt of any complaint; or if from online Bio-metric attendance it is found that teaching, non-teaching staff; hospital staff not present regularly, or hospital is not properly functional, or otherwise as required by the Central Government or by the Central Council; (b) any deficiencies arising within the said period shall be fulfilled by the college within hundred-fifty days under
- intimation to the Central Council otherwise the permission for a period of five years deemed to be withdrawn;
  (c) colleges which were permitted for a period not exceeding five years from the academic session 2014-15 to 2018-19 and 2015-16 to 2019-20 shall be maintain the requirements as specified under the regulations 4 to 11
- otherwise the permission for a period of five years deemed to be withdrawn.

  (3) Requirements of Minimum Standard to grant of conditional permission of one year-
  - (a) The conditional permission of one year for particular academic session shall be granted only to those colleges which are fulfilling following requirements on the basis of the inspection by the Central Council between the 31st December to the 31st March for the succeeding academic session:
  - the requirement of teachers as specified in the Schedule-V;
  - (ii) the requirement of teaching hospital as specified under sub-regulation (2) of regulation 7;
  - (iii) availability of minimum seventy-five percent. of required equipment as specified in the Schedule-VII;
  - (iv) availability of herbal garden as specified in the Schedule-III;
  - (v) availability of hospital staff as specified in the Schedule-IV,
  - (vi) availability of technical and other staff as specified in the Schedule-VI;
  - (vii) availability of college council as specified in sub-regulation (1) of regulation 9;
  - (viii) availability of college website as specified in sub-regulation (2) of regulation 9;
  - (ix) availability of biometric attendance as specified in sub-regulation (3) of regulation 9; and
  - (x) availability of minimum constructed area of college and hospital as specified in regulation 5.
  - (b) the colleges, which have been granted conditional permission or which have been denied permission for the academic session 2015-16 shall be required to fulfill the requirements as specified above in clause (a) to obtain the conditional permission of one year for particular academic session or for a period of five years as specified in the regulations 4 to 11.

#### 4. Requirement of Land-

- The total build up area required for adequate infrastructure including medical college, hospital and other infrastructure required under these regulations, is made available in a single piece of land, not less than three acres, for an intake capacity up to sixty seats.
- For intake capacity from sixty-one to hundred seats, the land shall not be less than five acres and in not more than two plots at a distance not exceeding two kilo meters, and the plot, if separated by a road or canal or rivulet but connected with a bridge, shall be treated as one piece of land.
- The total constructed area shall be based upon the permissible Floor Area Ratio or Floor Space Index allowed by the authority concerned or local laws or rules.
- (4) For permission of Central Government, a certificate from the local municipal authority certifying or approving the construction plan of the proposed buildings having the required construction area as per the Schedule-I and the
- Constitution plan of the proposed outsings having in required constitution area as per the scientific and the Schedule-I make the Schedule-I which shall be accommodated in the piece of land, shall be provided at the time of applying. The land shall be owned by the college or possessed on lease, in the name of the college, for a period not less than ninety-nine years or the maximum permissible period as per rules or regulations of the respective State Government or Union territory and the renewal of permission shall, however, be required on expiry of lease. The requirement of the size and possession of the land is not applicable for the colleges established prior to the (5)
- (6) 7<sup>th</sup>November, 2003, but at the end of the current lease period, such colleges shall either own the land or get it on the lease for a period not less than ninety-nine years or the maximum permissible period as per rules or regulations of the respective State Government or Union territory.

- 5. Requirement of minimum constructed area (1) The college and attached hospital shall have the constructed area of two thousand square meter each for intake (1) capacity up to sixty seats.
- The college and attached hospital which have intake capacity of sixty-one to hundred seats shall have the (2)constructed area of four thousand and three thousand and five hundred square meters, respectively.

#### NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 8th March, 2013

No. 12-10/2000-CCH (Pt. III).—In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (j) of section 33 of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 (59 of 1973), and in supersession of the Homoeopathy (Minimum Standards of Education) Regulations, 1983, except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Central Council of Homoeopathy, with the previous sanction of the Central Government, hereby makes the following regulations, namely:-

- 1. Short title and commencement.— (1) These regulations may be called the Homoeopathy Central Council (Minimum Standards Requirement of Homoeopathic Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations 2013.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- 2. Definitions.- In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:-
  - (a) "Act" means the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 (59 of 1973);
  - (b) "attached hospital" means a teaching Homoeopathic Hospital attached to the Homoeopathic College;
  - (c) "college" means a medical college of Homoeopathy, whether known as such or by any other name, in which a person under goes a course of study and training including any Post Graduate Course of Study and training, which will qualify him for the award of a recognised medical qualification in Homoeopathy;
  - (d) "Courses" means the courses of study in Homoeopathy, namely:
    - (i) B.H.M.S. (Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery)
    - (ii) M.D. (Hom.) [Doctor of Medicine (Homoeopathy)] in various specialties.
  - (e) "diploma" means a Diploma in Homoeopathy as defined in clause (iii) of regulation 2 of the Homoeopathy (Diploma Course) Regulations, 1983;
  - (f) "degree" means a Degree in Homoeopathy as defined in clause (iv) of regulation 2 of the Homoeopathy (Graded Degree Course) Regulations, 1983 or in clause (iv) of regulation 2 of the Homoeopathy (Degree Course) Regulations, 1983;
  - (g) "Post Graduation in Homoeopathy" means a Post Graduate qualification in Homoeopathy recognized as per the provisions of the Act;
  - (h) "Teaching Experience" means teaching experience in the subject concerned in a Homoeopathic College and includes teaching experience in the subject concerned in a Medical College permitted by the Central Government;
  - (i) the words and expression used herein and not defined, but defined in the Act shall have the respective meanings assigned to them in the Act.

#### 3. Fulfillment of minimum standard requirements.

- (1) The college and attached hospital(s) shall fulfill the minimum standards requirements of infrastructure and teaching and training facilities referred to in the regulations 4 to 13.
- (2) For exposure of the students in the clinical field and to understand the depth of operative surgery and operative Gynecology or Obstetrics as well as management in critical illnesses, a college shall have a Memorandum of Understanding with a reputed nearby located super-specialty hospital (of modern medicine) with all required facilities of operation theatre, labor room, Intensive Care Unit and other required facilities for the management of critical patients.

**OPERATION THEATRE:** A well equipped and functioning Operation theatre shall be provided for day to day working.

Note: Rehabilitation unit including Physiotherapy and Yoga facilities shall be provided as a separate unit in the hospital premises.

An Ambulance with all required facilities shall be provided as a part and parcel of hospital facilities

The Homoeopathic Teaching Hospital shall have well furnished separate dispensaries for its out-door and in-door departments containing sufficient stock of drugs. A first-Aid kit also be kept in Outdoor and Indoor departments/dispensaries. Such a Hospital shall have X-Ray, E.C.G., Screening and Sonography units, well equipped clinical laboratories.

# REVISED MINIMUM STANDARDS TO START NEW PHYSIOTHERAPY COLLEGE/ FOR RENEWAL OF PHYSIOTHERAPY COLLEGE PROPOSED ON 20/09/2021

As per section 24(1) of Gujarat State Council for Physiotherapy Act No.18 of 2011 Application has to be done before 31st March by College Authority.

Gujarat State Council for Physiotherapy with the assurance of permission from Government of Gujarat hereby makes the following Regulations namely "Gujarat State Council for Physiotherapy Minimum Standards for opening a new Physiotherapy College"

#### Short title and commencement-

- (1) These regulations may be called the Establishment of Physiotherapy College, 2021.
- (2) They shall come into force after the date of approval from Government of Gujarat.

#### **Definition**-

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, "Physiotherapy college" means any institution by whatever name called in which a person may undergo a course of study or training which will qualify him for the award of Bachelor of Physiotherapy and / or Master of Physiotherapy.

The establishment of a Physiotherapy college – No person shall establish a Physiotherapy college except after obtaining prior permission from the State Government

#### I. ABOUT THE COURSE

#### (1) Nomenclature of Course:

Bachelor of Physiotherapy (B.Physio. / B.P.T.)

#### (2) **Duration of Course:**

B. Physiotherapy is full time course with duration of four and half years including 6 months compulsory rotating internship. Such an internship to be carried out in the Hospital approved by GSCPT and that has a functioning Physiotherapy department and a qualified Physiotherapist employed who is a registered member of GSCPT.

#### (3) Aim of the Course:

The course aims at imparting in depth both the theoretical knowledge as well as the skills in Physiotherapy System of Medicine.

#### (4) Objective of course:

During the comprehensive academic program, the basic and clinical sciences are integrated to:

- (1) Develop knowledge, skills and attitude necessary for competent health education, diagnosis, prevention, treatment, recovery and rehabilitation of patients from trauma and disease.
- (2) Focus on development of clinical and research aptitude.
- (3) Train them to practice the profession of Physiotherapy in a competent and ethical manner towards those who need such services with autonomy, quality care, assurance and humanitarian approach with compassion.

#### (5) Syllabus:

Approved syllabus of the affiliated University & in accordance with the Gujarat State Council for Physiotherapy as and when it is approved by the government.

#### (6) Admission Criteria:

For admission to the First B. Physiotherapy course, a candidate -

- (a) Shall have passed the Higher Secondary Certificate Examination with science subjects (physics, chemistry and biology) conducted by the Gujarat Higher Secondary Education Board or an examination considered as equivalent by the Gujarat Government and Admission Committee with atleast 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry, Biology & English.
- (b) Shall have completed the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year in which he/she is be admitted.
- (c) Institution shall have to adopt procedure laid down by the Admission Committee for Professional Medical / Paramedical educational courses for admission managed by Gujarat State Government. (The name subject to change as per the State Government discretion)
- (d) Self finance Institution shall follow the rules laid down by the Gujarat Government for admission in management and NRI quota.
- (e) Candidate should have appeared in the GUJ-CET (Gujarat Common Entrance Test) for the current academic year.
- (7) **Fees:** As per the rules laid down by Gujarat Government & Government Fee Committee.

#### (8) University affiliation:

College shall be affiliated to the UGC approved Universities of Gujarat and it should be within its jurisdiction.

#### II. QUALIFYING CRITERIA-

The eligible persons shall qualify to apply for permission to establish Physiotherapy College if the following conditions are fulfilled:-

1. That Physiotherapy education is one of the objectives of the applicant in case the applicant is an autonomous body, registered society, charitable trust & companies registered under Company Act.

#### 2. LAND AND BUILDING -

- a. That the applicant Institution / Trust should have a separate independent building for Physiotherapy College and Physiotherapy clinical services and should have adequate scope of expansion.
- b. Such a building should be constructed in such a way that there is adequate parking space and recreational area or open space for students.
- c. Such a building should have adequate space and should have out-patient Physiotherapy department, various laboratories as needed, office space, class rooms, hostel and other ancillary facilities.
- d. Minimum built up area for such a college should be 25,000 sq.ft.
- e. Building should be barrier free and as per NBCI guidelines (National Building Code of India).
- f. Building must be recorded on the appellate institute name or if a lease hold land, it must be for at least 10 years
- g. Building must have Fire NOC
- h. Building must allow access to handicap/specially abled person.
- i. Building must have CCTV camera.

#### 3. PHYSIOTHERAPY O.P.D:

A well equipped OPD facility in physiotherapy with instruments of all specialties like Orthopedics, Neurology, Cardio respiratory and Women's Health should be available at the college premises. A student/ patient ratio of 1:5 should be maintained.

In addition to own Physiotherapy OPD in the college building, the College can get attachment to maximum 5 Physiotherapy Clinic/OPD with minimum 50 patients OPD workload per day.

An out-patient department at the tie-up facility cannot be considered as an independent OPD unit of the college.

#### 4. HOSPITAL / HOSPITAL ATTACHMENT –

- a. Hospital: Total Bed strength: 300 beds.
- b. Along with the attachment with Hospitals, College should have their own minimum 50 bedded hospital.
- c. Affiliated hospitals must have minimum 50 bed strength, with an indoor and outdoor facility with physiotherapy exposure in the areas such as orthopedics, surgery, including plastic surgery, burns and gym and obs, medicine including rheumatology and neurology; pediatrics; respiratory medicine and cardiology

- including critical care; radiology; cardiothoracic and neuro- surgery and etc as per syllabus/Council totaling 300 beds.
- d. College can get attachment to maximum five (5) hospitals. Tie up hospitals cannot get attached to more than two colleges
- e. If the affiliated hospital is attached with two colleges, the bed strength will be divided amongst the colleges.
- f. The affiliated hospital shall provide information regarding any MOU with other colleges, if any& MOU should be for at least five years.

#### Note:-

- (i) For fresh applicants Trust should have its own hospital with 50 beds.
- (ii) In existing colleges which have started after 2009, should give an undertaking to Government that they will construct their own hospital with minimum 50 beds within a period of three years.
- (iii) Own hospital Bed strength should be increased according to the increase of intake of students.
- (iv) Attached Hospital (Govt. / Civil / Private) must be within 25 km. radius of the college. A bus service is mandatory to the hospital located more than 1km away from the College.
  - 5. That the Applicant Institution / Trust / College have obtained Government Essentiality to begin the Physiotherapy College and affiliation from the respective University.
  - 6. Every year college should be inspected till the final year.

#### III. FINANCES AND BUDGET

The Institution / Trust / Governing Body should attach audited Balance Sheet of Last three years and Budget Provision for current year along with the form while submitting for registration Financial details should consist of total income from all sources, total expenditures, non-movable assets, movable assets and liabilities.

Indemnity Bond - At the time of submitting the requests for Essentiality Certificate, College should submit a letter from a Nationalized Bank that the Bank will give Bank Guarantee to Govt. of Gujarat on behalf of College. Indemnity Bond, in the form of Bank Guarantee, of the amount decided by the State Government from a Nationalized Bank to Government of Gujarat should be submitted before admission of students. After validity of Indemnity Bond, college should renew the Indemnity Bond from time to time.

A photo declaration should be given by the part time teachers indicating their willingness/working at the said institution and declaration of working with other Colleges.

- \* For clinical therapists/tutors, more staffs should be recruited in such a way that a patient to clinical therapists/tutors ratio is maintained to 15:1. Tutors can also be given academic work of tutorial/practical.
- \* It is recommended to have 3 Ortho/Musculoskeletal, 3 Neurology, 3 CardioPulmonary and 3 Rehabilitation MPT specialities for 50 seats Intake.

#### Philosophy

National Health Policy(NHP) 2002 emphasizes the need to prepare nurses to function in super-speciality areas who are required in tertiary care institutions, entrusting some limited public health functions to nurses after providing adequate training, and increase the ratio of degree holding vis a vis diploma holding nurses.

It is observed that there is an acute shortage of nursing faculty in under graduate and post graduate nursing programme in India

Indian Nursing Council believes that:

Post Graduate programme is essential to prepare nurses to improve the quality of nursing education and practice in India. .

Post graduate programme in nursing builds upon and extends competence acquired at the graduate levels, emphasizes application of relevant theories into nursing practice, education, administration and development of research skills.

The programme prepares nurses for leadership position in nursing and health fields who can function as nurse specialists, consultants, educators, administrators and researchers in a wide variety of professional settings in meeting the National priorities and the changing needs of the society.

This programme provides the basis for the post masteral programme in nursing. Further the programme encourages accountability and commitment to life long learning which fosters improvement of quality care.

#### Aim

The aim of the postgraduate program in nursing is to prepare graduates to assume responsibilities as nurse specialists, consultants, educators, administrators in a wide variety of professional settings

#### **Objectives**

On Completion of the two year M.Sc Nursing programme, the graduate will be able to:-

- 1. Utilize/apply the concepts, theories and principles of nursing science
- 2. Demonstrate advance competence in practice of nursing
- Practice as a nurse specialist.
- 4. Demonstrate leadership qualities and function effectively as nurse educator and manager.
- 5. Demonstrate skill in conducting nursing research, interpreting and utilizing the findings from health related research.

- 6. Demonstrate the ability to plan and effect change in nursing practice and in the health care delivery system.
- 7. Establish collaborative relationship with members of other disciplines
- 8. Demonstrate interest in continued learning for personal and professional advancement.

# Guidelines and Minimum Requirements for setting up of a College of Nursing

- 1. Any organization under the Central Government, State Government, Local body or a Private or Public Trust, Mission, Voluntary registered under Society Registration Act or a Company registered under company's act wishes to open a M.Sc. Nursing programme, should obtain the No Objection/Essentiality certificate from the State Government.
- 2. The Indian Nursing council on receipt of the proposal from the Institution to start nursing program, will undertake the first inspection to assess suitability with regard to physical infrastructure, clinical facility and teaching faculty in order to give permission to start the programme.
- 3. After the receipt of the permission to start the nursing programme from Indian Nursing Council, the institution shall obtain the approval from the State Nursing Council and University.
- 4. Institution will admit the students only after taking approval of State Nursing Council and University.
- 5. The Indian Nursing Council will conduct inspection every year till the first batch completes the programme. Permission will be given year by year till the first batch completes.
- 6. If the institution is recognized for B.Sc. (N) programme and if one batch has passed out after found suitable by INC, then the institution will be exempted from NOC/Essentiality certificate for M.Sc.(N) programe from the State Government.
- 7. **Super Speciality Hospital\*** can start M.Sc.(N) programme, however they have to get NOC/Essentiality certificate from respective State Government to start the M.Sc. (N) programme.

# [INDIAN NURSING COUNCIL {REVISED REGULATIONS AND CURRICULUM FOR B.SC. (NURSING) PROGRAM), REGULATIONS, 2020]

F.No. 11-1/2019-INC.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of Section 16 of the Indian Nursing Council Act, 1947 (XLVIII of 1947), as amended from time to time, the Indian Nursing Council hereby makes the following regulations namely:—

#### SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

- These Regulations may be called The Indian Nursing Council (Revised Regulations and Curriculum for B.Sc. (Nursing) Program) Regulations, 2020.
- ii. These Regulations shall come into force on the date of notification of the same in the official Gazette of India.

#### DEFINITIONS

In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,

- i. 'the Act' means the Indian Nursing Council Act, 1947 (XLVIII of 1947) as amended from time to time;
- ii. 'the Council' means the Indian Nursing Council constituted under the Act of 1947;
- 'SNRC' means the State Nurses and Midwives Registration Council by whichever name constituted and called by the respective State Governments;
- 'B.Sc. (Nursing)' means the four year B.Sc. (Nursing) Degree qualification in Nursing recognized by the Council under Section 10 of the Act and included in Part-II of the Schedule to the Act;
- v. 'Authority' means a University or Body created by an Act for awarding the B.Sc. (Nursing) qualification recognized by the Council and included in Part-II of the Schedule to the Act;
- vi. 'School of Nursing' means a recognized training institution for the purpose of teaching of the GNM course;
- vii. 'College' means a recognized training institution for the purpose of training and teaching of the B.Sc. (Nursing) course;
- viii. 'CNE' means Continuing Nursing Education to be compulsorily undergone by the RN&RM/ RANM/RLHV for renewal of registration after every 5 (five) years.

#### I. INTRODUCTION OF THE PROGRAM

The B.Sc. nursing degree program is a four-year fulltime program comprising eight semesters, which prepares B.Sc. nursing graduates qualified to practice nursing and midwifery in a variety of settings in either public/government or private healthcare settings. It adopts credit system and semester system as per the Authority guidelines with minor modifications suitable to professional education in a hybrid form. The program encompasses foundational, core and elective courses. The choice-based system is applicable to electives only and is offered in the form of modules. Modular learning is also integrated in the foundational as well as core courses that is mandatory.

The program prepares nurses and midwives for generalist nursing including midwifery practice. Knowledge acquisition related to wellness, health promotion, illness, disease management and care of the dying is core to nursing practice. Mastery of competencies is the main focus. Students are provided with opportunities to learn a whole range of skills in addition to acquiring knowledge related to nursing practice (nursing and midwifery). This is achieved through learning in skill lab/simulated lab and clinical environment. Simulation will be integrated throughout the curriculum wherever feasible to enable them to develop competencies before entry into real field of practice.

The revised curriculum embraces competency-based and outcome-based approach throughout the program integrating mastery learning and self-directed learning. Transformational and relationship based educational approaches are emphasized. Through the educational process the students assimilate and synthesize knowledge, cultivate critical thinking skills and develop care strategies. Competencies that reflect practice standards of the Council address the areas of cultural diversity, communication technology, teamwork and collaboration, safety, quality, therapeutic interventions and evidence-based practice. They are prepared to provide safe and competent care to patients across life span and influence patient outcomes.

#### II. PHILOSOPHY

The Council believes that:

Health and wellness are two fundamental concepts that are integrated throughout the program. Health is a state of well-being that encompasses physical, psychological, social, economic and spiritual dimensions. Wellness is the individual's perception of wellness and is influenced by the presence of disease and individual's ability to adapt. Health is a right of all people. Individuals have a right to be active participants in achieving health as they perceive it. Society consists of dynamic and interactive systems involving individuals, families, groups and communities. Cultural diversity, race, caste, creed, socio economic levels, religion, lifestyles, changes in environment and political factors influence it. Nurses and midwives recognize and respect human differences and diversity of population within society and provide ethical care with respect and dignity and protect their rights.

Nursing as a profession and a discipline utilizes knowledge derived from arts, sciences (physical, biological and behavioral), humanities and human experience. Nursing science incorporates clinical competence, critical thinking, communication, teaching learning, professionalism, and caring and cultural competency. Nurses collaborate with other health disciplines to solve individual and community health problems. Nursing facilitates evidence-based practice, compassionate caring among its practitioners in response to emerging issues in healthcare and new discoveries and technologies in profession. Nursing practice requires personal commitment to professional development and life-long learning.

Scope of nursing and midwifery practice encompasses provision of promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative aspects of care to people across the life span in a wide variety of healthcare settings. Nursing practice is based on acquisition of knowledge, understanding, attitude, competencies and skills through the Council's curricular and practice standards. The competencies in which the students are trained will guide them in performing their scope of practice. Nursing offers qualified nurses and midwives a wealth of opportunities in the field of practice, education, management and research in India and overseas.

The undergraduate nursing program is broad based education within an academic curricular framework specifically directed to the development of critical thinking skills, competencies appropriate to human and professional values. Blended learning approach comprising of experiential learning, reflective learning, scenario based learning and simulated learning is also inbuilt. The teaching learning process encourages mastery learning, modular, self-directed and self-accountable in choice making in terms of elective courses. The program prepares its graduates to become exemplary citizens by adhering to code of ethics and professional conduct at all times in fulfilling personal, social and professional obligations so as to respond to national aspirations. Health and community orientation are provided with special emphasis on national health problems, national health programs and national health policy directives to achieve universal health care for all citizens of India. The main roles of graduates would be provider of care with beginning proficiency in delivering safe care, coordinator/manager of care by being active participant of inter-professional team and member of a profession demonstrating self-responsibility and accountability for practice as well as to support the profession.

The faculty has the responsibility to be role models and create learning environment that facilitates cultivation of critical thinking, curiosity, creativity and inquiry driven self- directed learning and attitude of life-long learning in students. Learners and educators interact in a process whereby students gain competencies required to function within their scope of practice.

#### III. AIMS & OBJECTIVES

#### AIMS

The aims of the undergraduate program are to

- Produce knowledgeable competent nurses and midwives with clear critical thinking skills who are caring, motivated, assertive and well-disciplined responding to the changing needs of profession, healthcare delivery system and society.
- Prepare them to assume responsibilities as professional, competent nurses and midwives in providing promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative healthcare services in any healthcare setting.
- Prepare nurses and midwives who can make independent decisions in nursing situations within the scope of practice, protect the rights of individuals and groups and conduct research in the areas of nursing practice and apply evidencebased practice.
- 4. Prepare them to assume role of practitioner, teacher, supervisor and manager in all healthcare settings.

#### OBJECTIVES

On completion of the B.Sc. Nursing program, the B.Sc. nursing graduates will be able to

 Utilize critical thinking to synthesize knowledge derived from physical, biological, behavioural sciences, and humanities, in the practice of professional nursing and midwifery.



#### BUDGET

In the overall budget of the institution, there should be provision for college budget under a separate head. Principal of the College of Nursing should be the drawing and disbursing authority.

#### TEACHING FACULTY

The principal should be the administrative head of the College. He/She should hold qualifications as laid down by the Council. The principal should be the controlling authority for the budget of the College and also be the drawing and disbursing officer. The Principal and Vice-Principal should be gazetted officers in Government Colleges and of equal status (though non-Gazetted) in non-government Colleges.

#### Note:

- i. 1:10 teacher student ratio.
- All teachers including Principal & Vice Principal shall take classes, perform clinical teaching and supervision and other academic activities. Every faculty including Principal shall spend at least four hours each day.
- iii. One of the tutors need to stay at the community health field by rotation.
- iv. The salary of the teaching faculty in private Colleges of Nursing should not be less than what is admissible in the Colleges of Nursing under State/Central government or as per the UGC scales.
- v. Nursing service personnel should actively participate in instruction, supervision, guidance and evaluation of students in the clinical/community practice areas. The teaching faculty of the College of Nursing should work in close coordination with the nursing service personnel.
- vi. The teaching faculty of the College and nursing service personnel should be deputed to attend short term educational courses/workshops/conferences etc. to update their knowledge, skills and attitude.
- vii. It is mandatory for College authorities to treat teaching faculty of College of Nursing on duty with respect and dignity, when nominated/selected for the purpose of examination or inspection by the Council.
- viii. 50% of non-nursing courses/subjects should be taught by the nursing faculty. However, it will be supplemented by external faculty who are doctors or faculty in other disciplines having Post Graduate qualification in their requisite course. Nursing faculty who teach these courses shall be examiners for the taught course/s.


