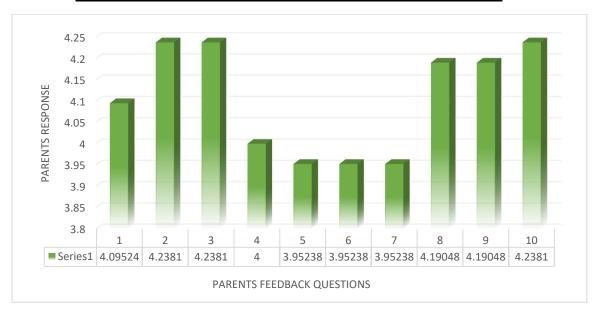

## 1. OBSERVATIONS BASED ON PARENTS' FEEDBACK QUESTIONNAIRE RESPONSES

Based on the feedback received from parents of students, several key observations were noted:

- Concern About Practical Exposure: Many parents expressed concerns that their children were not getting enough hands-on experience in real-world clinical environments. They believe that students need more clinical hours to ensure they are job-ready upon graduation.
- Curriculum Relevance: Parents indicated that they felt the current curriculum may not be fully aligned with the rapidly evolving healthcare industry. Some mentioned that their children felt the course content was outdated and lacked integration with the latest industry trends.
- Career Opportunities and Growth: Parents highlighted the limited options available for further academic or career growth, especially due to the lack of postgraduate programs. This was seen as a limitation for both faculty and students in terms of long-term career development.
- Satisfaction with Ethical Practices: Parents showed satisfaction with the department's commitment to maintaining ethical standards in both teaching and patient care. They appreciated the emphasis on professionalism and integrity in the program.

## 2. SUGGESTIONS RECEIVED FROM PARENTS

- Increase in Clinical Exposure: Parents suggested that students be
  provided with more opportunities for clinical exposure and handson experience, especially in hospital settings. They feel that this is
  essential for ensuring students are fully prepared for professional
  practice.
- Introduction of Advanced Programs: Several parents requested the introduction of postgraduate programs to ensure students have pathways for further academic progression and specialization after completing their undergraduate studies.





- Curriculum Enhancement: There was a strong suggestion to revise the curriculum to incorporate current industry advancements and evidence-based practices, ensuring students are prepared for modern healthcare challenges.
- **Strengthen Industry Connections**: Parents suggested fostering closer ties with industry professionals through internships, guest lectures, or collaborative programs, to help students gain realworld insights and networking opportunities.

#### 3. SUGGESTED ACTION

Based on the feedback from parents, the following actions are recommended to improve the academic environment and overall student development:

#### 1. Advocate for Increased Clinical Hours:

- Allocate more clinical and hands-on training hours to ensure students gain the necessary practical skills. Collaborate with local hospitals and healthcare facilities to provide real-world exposure.
- Action Plan: Work with the academic council to adjust the clinical hours allocation for the upcoming academic session (2020-2021).

#### 2. Develop Postgraduate Programs:

- Initiate the development of postgraduate programs within the department to offer students and faculty more options for advanced education and research opportunities.
- Action Plan: Create a roadmap for the establishment of postgraduate programs by the next academic year, with an aim to roll out the first batch by 2021.

### 3. Revise Curriculum for Industry Relevance:

 Conduct a thorough review of the current curriculum to integrate the latest industry practices and research. Ensure that students are exposed to cutting-edge knowledge and skills in their field of study.







o Action Plan: Form a curriculum committee to propose changes and implement these revisions in the upcoming academic session (2020-2021).

## 4. Enhance Industry Collaboration:

- Strengthen partnerships with healthcare institutions and industry professionals to provide students with more opportunities for internships, workshops, and collaborative projects.
- Action Plan: Establish a liaison committee to engage with local hospitals and healthcare organizations for collaboration opportunities starting from the next academic session.
