Points discussed:

- A. As Per discussion, we need to propose new syllabus: Masters of Physiotherapy in Neurological Conditions (agenda 1).
- B. As Per discussion, We need to increase the Seats for Ph.D in Physiotherapy, so we want to appoint one more Ph.D Guide for the same (agenda 2).
- C. Well structures research syllabus should be included in final year and it is recommended that the management should provide necessary research fund and facilities to execute research in a proper manner (agenda 3,4).
- D. For betterment of students the committee agreed to include assignments, unit test and practical based internal evaluation along with pre-existing internal examination. The university internal marks should be based on aforementioned criteria (agenda 5).
- E. The committee recommended filling the vacant post for the smooth functioning of institute as per the GSCPT Guidelines (agenda 6).
- F. The Committee member suggested to make a "student welfare committee" which works to provide scholarship to toppers and to economically backward students. Anti ragging cell, placement cell, student's safety insurance scheme, student related seminar, conferences, workshop should be made which work towards improving the welfare of students (agenda 7).
- G. The committee recommended to include multidisciplinary subjects under choice based credit system from next session as per the recommendation (agenda 8).
- H. The suggestions were made by all the committee members to include live demonstration on patients and to include traditional board and marker method along with other audio visual aids (agenda 9).
- I. The committee recommended for faculty to attend Conferences, Workshops and Participate in paper Publications, etc. (agenda 10).
- J. It is mandatory that all faculties should attend Teacher's Training workshop and Research Methodology workshop proposed by Gujarat Physiotherapy Teacher's Association, every 2-3 years (agenda 11).

The important discussed points were noted and will consider the points while planning the syllabus. By this the meeting came to an end by vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Kosha Gor







The particulars of the name of the College/Nursing Institution along with the name of the Trust/Society [as mentioned in Trust Deed or Memorandum of Association] as also full address shall be mentioned in No Objection Certificate/Essentiality Certificate.

- 4. After receipt of the Essentiality Certificate/No Objection Certificate, the eligible institution shall get recognition from the concerned SNRC for the M.Sc. (Nursing) program for the particular Academic Year, which is a mandatory requirement.
- 5. The Council shall after receipt of the above documents/proposal online would then conduct Statutory Inspection of the recognized training nursing institution under Section 13 of the Act in order to assess the suitability with regard to availability of Teaching Faculty, Clinical and Infrastructural Facilities in conformity with Regulation framed under the provision of the Act.

*Provided that training institutions shall apply for statutory inspection, under Section 13 of the Act, to the Council within 6 months from obtaining recognition from the SNRC.

Note:

- a. The Council has resolved that the candidates qualifying P.B.B.Sc. (Nursing) from Madhya Pradesh Bhoj University through distance education are not eligible for M.Sc. (Nursing) program.
- b. The Council has also resolved that the candidates qualifying P.B.B.Sc. (Nursing) from IGNOU through distance education are not eligible for M.Sc. (Nursing) program, if the study centres are not found suitable by the Council under Section 13 & 14 of the Act.

Strict Compliance of the Syllabus prescribed by the Council

No Institutions/SNRC/University will modify the syllabi prescribed by the Council for a course. However they can add units/subjects if need be.

Closing/Re-start of the Nursing Programs

If institutions have not admitted the students for 2 consecutive years, it shall be considered as closed. Institute may apply for suitability to the Council under Section 13 & 14 of the Act through online within 5 years of the closure. While conducting the inspection they will not be covered under the new guidelines with regard to Parent Hospital. However, the above relaxation will be applicable only for five years. In case the proposal is submitted after 5 years from the year of closure, it has to be a fresh proposal with due Essentiality Certificate from the State Government and

Re-inspection

Re-inspection application shall be considered only two times. institution is found deficient even after that, then the institution shall have to submit a proposal for Suitability under Section 13 & 14 of the INC Act, 1947 within 5 years. However in case the proposal is submitted after 5 years it has to be a fresh proposal with due Essentiality Certificate from the State Government and recognition from the SNRC.

Enhancement of Seats

Inspection for enhancement of seats under Section 13 of the INC Act, 1947 shall be conducted only once in an Academic Year i.e. only one application/ proposal shall be accepted, in one Academic Year. Further, SNRC approval is mandatory for enhancement of seats.

Bond System

Taking service bonds from students and forcefully retaining their Original Certificates is viewed as an unethical practice by the Indian Nursing Council. If any such practice comes to the notice of the Indian Nursing Council, appropriate action under Section 14 of the Indian Nursing Council Act, 1947 will be taken against the erring institution.

ADMISSION TERMS AND CONDITION

- The candidate should be a Registered Nurse and Registered midwife or equivalent with any State Nursing Registration Council.
- The Minimum education requirements shall be the passing of: B.Sc. Nursing/B.Sc. Hons. Nursing/Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing with minimum of 55% aggregate marks.
- The candidate should have undergone in B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.

Minimum one year of work experience after Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
