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ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

The anti-ragging committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision with regard to punishment or otherwise depending on the backs of each incident of ragging, nature and gravity of incident of the ragging.

AIMS & OBJECTIVES

- 1. To prevent, prohibit and redress any forms and instances of ragging in the college.
- 2. To educate the students about the meaning of ragging and what to constitute it.
- 3. To educate the students on the ill-effects of and the legal consequences of ragging.

ROLE OF ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

To prohibit, prevent and eliminate the source of ragging including and conduct by students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of tearing, treating or handling with rudeness to a fresher or any other student.

ROLE OF SQUAD

To be called upon to make surprise raids in hostels and other places where vulnerable incidents and having potential environment for ragging, shall be empowered to inspect such places.

FUNCTIONS OF SQUAD

- 1. To ensure overall disciplined environment in the college.
- 2. To initiate timely action against erring students.
- 3. To sensitize students about the evils of ragging and its prevention in college.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Anti-ragging squad will be to keep vigil and stop the incidence of ragging where any happening reported in the places of student's aggregation including classrooms, canteen, buses, grounds and hostels etc.

ANTEE-RAGGING COMMITTEE

RAGGING IN ANY FORM IS SRTICTLY PROHIBITED

- 1. Within the institute including department, canteen, campus etc.
- 2. In hostels, masses, canteens, cafeteria etc.
- 3. In playground, transportation buses etc.

PUNISHMENT by the Institute


- 1. Cancellation of admission, suspension, rustication or expulsion from the Institute/Hostel
- 2. Filling FIR at police station
- 3. Collective punishment may be imposed where the persons involvement is not identified.

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING

- 1. No person shall practice ragging in any term within or outside the premises of college.
- 2. Any person who violates or contrivances the provision of Anti-ragging act shall on conviction be punished with imprisonment for & term witch may extend up to 3 yrs. or with a fine up to 50,000 Rs. or both.
- 3. Teasing girl student in any manner is an offence and is punishable under the law. Hence students are advised to refrain from such activities, otherwise they would face strict legal actions.

INSTRUCTIONS SPECIFIC TO HOSTELS

- 1. No one or any particular student [senior] will be permitted to enter the fresher's hostel at any time, except with express permission from the warden.
- 2. Fresher students are not permitted to visit hostel of senior students.
- 3. The responsibility for ensuring the instruction will be of the security guard/guards on duty at the entry points of fresher's hostel.
- 4. All students shall report back in their respective hostel room latest by 9.00 pm.
- 5. Attendance of hostel students will be taken by 9.00 pm and reports submitted to the anti-ragging squad.
- 6. All the students shall abide by the hostel rules and anti-ragging regulations.

MEANING/DEFINITION/INSTRUCTIONS

Ragging means any act or inductor practice by dominant power of senior students / former students / outsiders brought to bear on the students who freshly enrolled or juniors by others and includes individual or collective acts or practice which involves

- a. Physical or psychological assault or threat or use to force or wrongful confinement or restraint.
- b. Violates status, dignity and honour of such student.
- c. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and effect their self-esteem.
- d. Entails verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviors.

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ANT-RAGGING COMMITTEE

EXPULSION FROM COLLEGE

As per the direction of honorable Supreme Court of India, ragging is a punishable offence. Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be expelled from college and FIR to be registered against him/her (student) and shall not be admitted in any other college/educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion. In case of ragging the students may contact the officers of anti-ragging committee immediately.

PUNISHMENTS

At the institution level- depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence an established Anti-ragging committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging, the Institution may impose following penalties on it. [any one or combined]

- 1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- 2. withholding/withdrawing scholarship fellowship and other benefits.
- 3. Debarring from appearing in any test examination or other evaluation process.
- 4. Withholding results.
- 5. Debarring from representing in any regional, national, international function/meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- 6. Suspension/expulsion from hostel.
- 7. Car cellation of admission.
- 8. Rustication from the institution for the period of 1 to 4 semesters.
- 9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- 10. Fine between rupees 25,000/- to 1 Lakh.
- 11. When the person commenting or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

At university level in respect of institutions under it- If any institution under the university fails to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations and fails to curb ragging effectively, the University may impose following penalties on it. [any one or combined]

- 1. Withdrawal of affiliation recognition or other privileges conferred on it
- 2. Prohibiting such institution from presenting any student then undergoing any programme of study for therein an award of any degree/diploma of university.
- 3. Withholding any grant allocated to student by university.
- 4. Any other appropriate penalty within powers of the University.
