Developed and administered by the Graduate

Management Admission Council (GMAC), the GMAT is recognized by over 7,000 programs at approximately 2,300 business schools worldwide.

Structure of GMAT (9:45 AM - 10:45 AM)

The GMAT consists of four main sections:

- 1. Analytical Writing Assessment (AWA): This section requires test-takers to write one essay analyzing an argument. The essay is scored on a scale of 0 to 6 by both a human grader and a computerized evaluation system.
- 2. Integrated Reasoning (IR): Introduced in 2012, this section assesses the ability to analyze and synthesize data presented in various formats (tables, graphs, etc.) from multiple sources. Questions may involve multi-step reasoning and require both quantitative and verbal skills.

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

The International English Language Testing System, commonly known as IELTS, is a globally recognized standardized test designed to assess the English language proficiency of non-native English speakers. Administered by the British Council, IDP: IELTS Australia, and Cambridge Assessment English, IELTS is accepted by educational institutions, employers, professional bodies, and government agencies worldwide as proof of English language proficiency for various purposes.

Structure and Components

IELTS is available in two versions: Academic and General Training. The structure of both versions is similar, with four main components:

- 1. Listening: This section evaluates a candidate's ability to understand spoken English in various contexts, such as conversations, monologues, and discussions. It consists of four sections, with ten questions each.
- 2. Reading: The reading test assesses the candidate's ability to understand written English texts. The Academic version includes three long texts ranging from descriptive and factual to discursive and analytical, while the General Training version includes extracts from books, magazines, newspapers, notices, advertisements, and company handbooks.
- 3. Writing: In this section, candidates are required to demonstrate their ability to write responses to given prompts. The Academic Writing module requires candidates to describe and interpret graphical data and to write a short essay in response to an argument or problem. The General Training Writing module requires candidates to write a letter in response to a given situation or issue and to write an essay in response to an argument or problem.
- 4. Speaking: The speaking test assesses the candidate's spoken English proficiency. It is a face-to-face interview conducted by a certified examiner and consists of three parts: an introduction and interview, a short individual presentation on a familiar topic, and a discussion.

Scoring

IELTS results are reported on a nine-band scale. Each band corresponds to a level of English proficiency, from non-user (band score 1) to expert (band score 9). The overall band score is the average of the four component scores, rounded to the nearest half or whole band. Different organizations and institutions may have specific band score requirements for admission, employment, or immigration purposes.

Uses and Importance

IELTS scores are widely accepted by educational institutions around the world for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate programs. Many professional organizations and employers also use IELTS scores to assess the English language proficiency of candidates seeking employment or professional certification. Additionally, some governments and immigration authorities require IELTS scores as part of the visa application process for studying or working abroad.
